

#### **Wisconsin Vietnam War Casualties**

According to the Defense Casualty Analysis System the total record count of deaths for Wisconsin is 1,161 as of April 29, 2008. (http://www.archives.gov/aad)

The month of May was the deadliest month for Wisconsin's armed forces with 137 fatalities. The worst months to be serving in Vietnam with most to least casualties are: May (137), March (136), February (115), June (105), January (95), April (94), November (88), August (87), July (84), September/October (74), and December (72). No month was any good with an average of 97 casualties per month overall.
